Telehandler Training Courses Saskatoon - Employers are responsible for making certain that their operating personnel and supervisors are trained to work proficiently utilizing telehandler equipment. The skill level of employees need to be assessed. If deficiencies are found, employers must provide training so that staff obtain the required level of ability. The level of responsibility of the individual needs to be considered when training is provided. Effective training will solve whichever deficiencies in the knowledge, skills and understanding of telehandler operators and supervisors. Training may be undertaken through in-house session or by engaging the services of an external training provider. An assessment upon finishing the training period will determine whether or not the learning objectives have been met.

Regulations and guidelines for the basic telehandler operator testing and training are set by local, federal and state/provincial regulators. Basic training does not address such topics as the lifting of suspended loads, the lifting of persons, the use of rotating machinery or using other attachments. Further training would have to be undertaken if such tasks are needed on the work location.

Maintenance and Inspection

Similar to whatever machinery, a telehandler needs effective maintenance. The machinery inevitably would suffer wear sooner or later. Correct maintenance is vital to ensuring safe operation of the telehandler equipment. Inspections and checks are important to ongoing maintenance procedures. Operators need to have machine-specific training in order to prevent, rectify and monitor problems connected with deterioration, damage and wear. Staff require competence and experience in both periodic and breakdown maintenance. The preventive maintenance directions of the manufacturer must be seriously viewed and complied with, considering such factors as environmental circumstances in the work setting and frequency of use.

The user of the equipment along with the owner of the machine share the responsibility for making sure that the telehandler is in full working condition. Pre-use inspections are typically performed by the user, whilst general maintenance is usually performed by the telehandler owner.
