Accredited operators are required to operate and run articulated cranes under 16,000 lbs. capacity. The articulated crane operator should have knowledge concerning the many operational characteristics and features of the machinery. Prior to use, a preoperational machine check should be carried out. There is a legal requirement to perform a pre-operational inspection and an inspection of the work-site ground and overhead conditions.

The manufacturer's directions provide information regarding inspection and maintenance, unloading and loading of the crane. The law requires annual and daily inspections. Drivers have to maintain an up-to-date logbook in most regions. They may be required to certify machine warranties.

It is suggested that businesses add remote control devices to their cranes. Remote control improves safety by enabling the driver an easier alternative for handling the crane.

Prioritizing crane safety helps a company's bottom line. Companies which follow safe equipment practices normally enjoy bigger cost savings as opposed to those which don't. The risk of personal injury and machine damage is really lessened when a well trained driver is handling the crane. Safety conscious drivers are more productive leading to less times required for unloading and loading.
